The museum features Ithaca Gun memorabilia, promotional items and, of course the history of this product developed and built in the area since 1880. You can also take a look at the newest addition to the Ithaca Gun line but more on **that** later.

The annual Christmas Craft Fair will be held at the Southern Cayuga High School in Poplar Ridge on November 2 from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm. This event is over 25 years old.

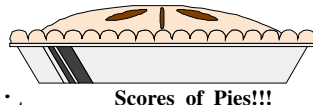
