

Sewer District Committee To Report in January

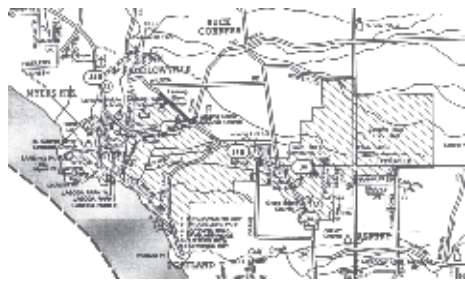

ments include capital cost recovery plus actual volume-based user fees.

But as past research has shown, there are simply not enough businesses and residential users in the proposed district to finance the project all by themselves. The availability of non-user funding sources will likely be a key indicator of the project's viability.

That's why the committee has been pursuing five additional fund streams that, individually or collectively, may reduce (or totally eliminate) the amount of capital cost that has to be repaid by system users.

The committee is considering whether the proposed sewage collection and treatment system may be eligible for federal aid through Housing and Urban Development (HUD) grants and/or low-interest loans. Significant portions of the town's water distribution infra-structure have been aided by



HUD. Second, the committee is looking for support from the US Rural Development Agency (formerly known as the Farmers' Home Administration).

The committee has also talked with state officials to see whether money may be accessed through the state's Environmental Facilities Corporation through the state revolving fund. With the recent passage of the 1996 Environmental Bond Act, grant opportunities through this source of project funding are also being pursued.

Finally, several local industries and institutions have also been approached in a preliminary manner to participate in funding.

Project Status

"Our primary concern now," said Herrick, "is having consensus on discharge permit requirements from the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC). We hope to have a formal response before the end of the year."

Once the DEC reaches its decision and the budget is fine-tuned, the committee will announce the date for its January public informational meeting.
