JV Games

Coach Slutsky felt that the boys gained a lot of confidence this year for a young team and has good prospects for next year.

In other business, the Commissioners will be bringing in an outside expert to speak at the Feb. 25 work party on developing a "service awards" program to retain trained membership.

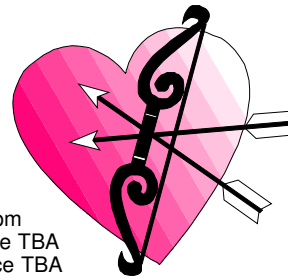
