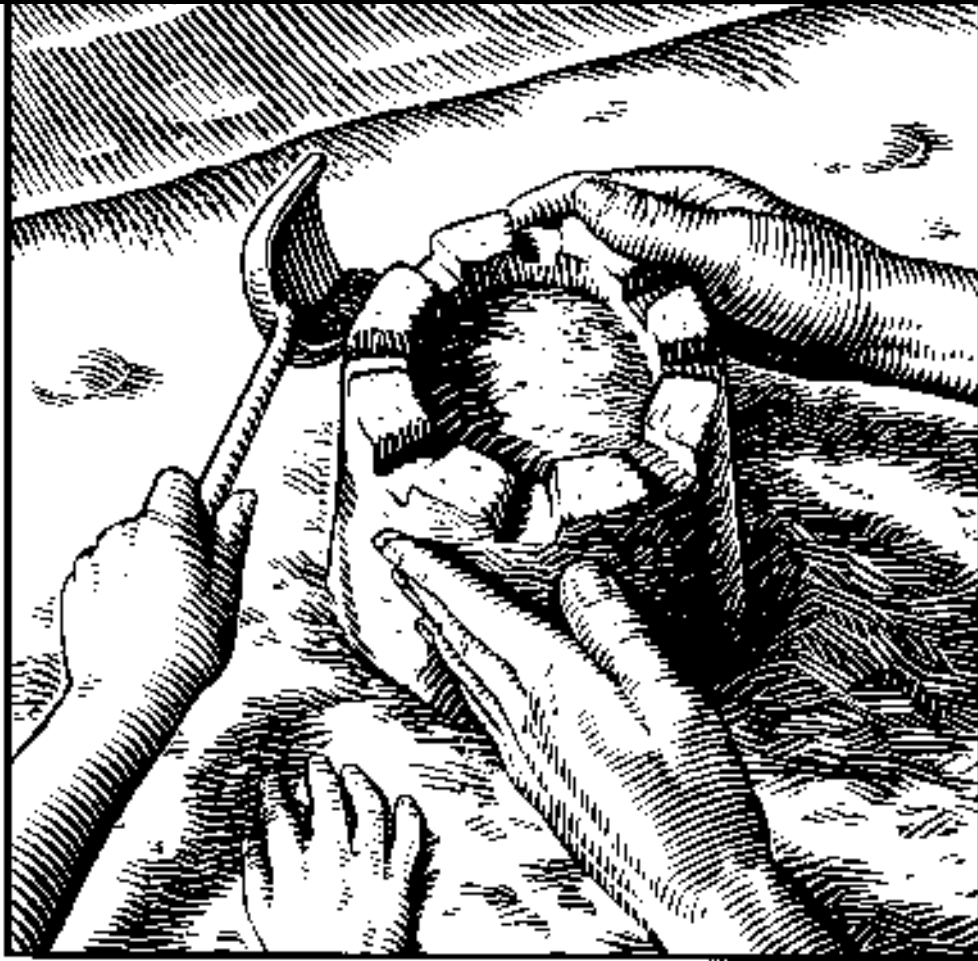
The informal networking group boasts no officers, no paid memberships and no formal programs but provides local small business owners with the opportunity to share information, ideas and contacts.

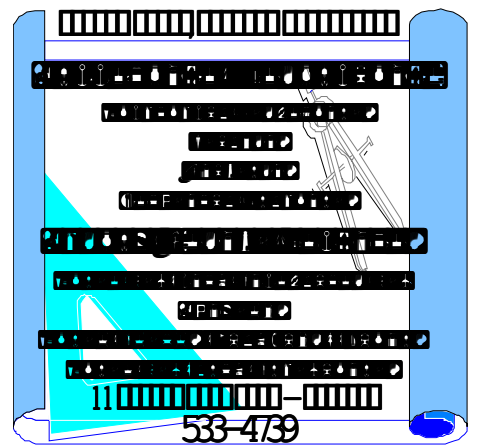
