

Trudeau Selected As Principal At Southern Cayuga High School

Mimi Trudeau was unanimously selected March 7 from a pool of 14 applicants to serve as principal at Southern Cayuga High School.

Trudeau, a Dryden resident, comes to the Southern Cayuga Central School system with numerous qualifications. Her academic preparation includes an undergraduate degree in Floriculture and Ornamental Horticulture, a Master's degree in Agriculture, both from Cornell, and a certificate of advanced study from SUNY Cortland.

Trudeau will be coming to Southern Cayuga from the Lansing's NYS Division for Youth Louis Gossett Residential Center. There she serves as principal and is responsible not only for the formal educational program, but also for vocational programs and non-formal educational programs geared to the residents' special needs.

"Mimi has been instrumental in instituting a new instructional model at Gossett,"

said Director Steven Farkas. "Her work allowed us to take our limited educational staffing to provide a full educational curriculum to meet the many needs of our kids."

Trudeau previously worked at the Lansing Residential Center for girls where she taught science and independent living as well as serving as a vocational instructor. She also worked as the principal of a community-based Division for Youth school in Syracuse.

Trudeau replaces current interim principal Vincent Hemmer and former principal Maria Fragnoni-Ryan who resigned in December of 1996. Her three year probationary appointment begins April 1st at a starting salary of \$54,000.
