



New Myers Park Playground

Families enjoying the newly erected Pavilion "D" will be able to let young children safely wander over to a new playground located between the park admission office and the drydock area in the southwest portion of Myers Park.

"We wanted to start developing a portion of the park that's not been used much in the past," said Lansing Parks and Recreation Director Steve Colt.

Last autumn, the Town decommissioned old Pavilion "D" near the boat launch and converted it into a storage building. A new 48' x 36' Pavilion, complete with several grills, was erected near the drydock area. "We put in the playground to protect youngsters so they don't have to cross the roadway in order to play in a sandbox or swing," explained Colt.

The playground is now under construction and will feature an all-weather play

structure, two spring-mounted rocking animals, four swings, several benches and a partially-shaded 10' x 10' sandbox. The entire playground area has a surface of crushed mulch bordered by small wood retaining beams.

The playground was designed by landscape architect (and Ludlowville resident) Steven T. Lauzen of Parkitects, Inc.

The \$4,500 project cost, most of which represented the cost of the all-weather play structure, was previously included in the Parks and Recreation Department's budget.

REMINDER

There have been many complaints that dogs are running free in the park, said Colt. ALL DOGS MUST BE ON A LEASH no longer than 10 feet in length in Myers Park. The leash law will be enforced and tickets will be issued to violators.
